

Inspired

1. What caught your attention in this week's message? Was there something you had never heard before or something you had a question about?
2. How would you describe your general attitude and appetite for God's word?
3. When you consider your personal study of the Bible, do any of the following responses resonate with you?
 - "I try to read the Bible, but I don't really get anything out of it."
 - "I find parts of the Bible really difficult to understand or accept."
 - "I struggle to make time to read the Bible every day."
 - "I struggle to even want to make time to read the Bible every day."
 - "There are parts of my life where I don't want to obey what the Bible teaches."
4. Our response to God's word is our response to God Himself. We all can recognize that each of us are in different places and have different capacities in our walks with the Lord.
 - What steps can you take to better hear God's voice well through His word?
5. The Bible is both a mirror that reflects ourselves back to us, and a window that shows us God's glory.
 - When you read the Bible (Psalm 119, for example), what does it tell you about yourself?
 - What does it tell you about God and His glory?
6. Read Psalm 119:50 and Psalm 119:92.
 - Think about a time when God provided you with comfort through His word.
 - What were the circumstances, and what passage(s) did He use to comfort you?

Pray about it: Meditate on God's Word (Psalm 119) and this week's message

Adoration: What can I praise God for in light of what this teaches me?

Confession: What sin can I confess because of what this teaches me?

Thanksgiving: What can I thank God for in light of what He has done?

Supplication: What do I need to ask of God in order to grow in light of this?
