

<u>give</u>

- What does this word mean to you?
- What is Jesus suggesting by using this word the way He does?
- How does using this word mean complete dependence on God?

<u>us</u>

- In what way(s) can we make this prayer more than just about us?
- How does this mean complete humility?

this day (today)

- Why is it so easy for us to be concerned about the past and future over the present?
- Why do you think Jesus said "this day" in the prayer? What point is He trying to make?
- How does this demonstrate complete surrender?

our daily bread

- What is Jesus trying to explain with these words?
- How does this demonstrate complete provision?
- Read Exodus 16:4-5, Deuteronomy 29:5, and 1 Kings 17:13-16. What do these passages say about God's provision?
- 3. Have you ever thought of Matthew 6:11 as being preventative? Read Proverbs 30:8-9. How do these verses relate to Matthew 6:11?

Pray about it: Meditate on God's Word (Matthew 6:11) and this week's message.

Adoration: What can I praise God for in light of what this teaches me?

Confession: What sin can I confess because of what this teaches me?

Thanksgiving: What can I thank God for in light of what He has done?

Supplication: What do I need to ask of God in order to grow in light of this?
