In 2007, the doors to our current location at Sanitarium Road were opened. As ministries quickly grew, we found ourselves in need of more classroom space, especially for our children's ministries. Thus, we moved forward with a children's wing addition.

"What a wonderful experience that was watching the church go up. It's wonderful to see it being used!" said Rose Bigley, a member of the 2002-2007 Building Team. "Of course, we didn't have the funds to build everything we wanted and that the studies showed we needed."

Our current ministries are robust for the oldest saint all the way down to the youngest child. On Sunday mornings, every section of the Children's Wing is used for Uptown Kids. Our middle school and high school youth meet in borrowed rooms that are not conducive to their size or need. Back rooms of the Worship Center cannot be utilized due to sound difficulties, which does not leave space for adult discipleship classes during each service.

We find that on Wednesday evenings, our space continues to shrink as more than 150 children and youth move throughout every inch of the building during Awana and Youth Group. Bible studies have tried to meet in the building on Wednesday evenings as an extension of ministry during that time, however, they must resign to a small corner of the building.

During each week, our space is used for various activities including, but not limited to, home school co-ops, meetings, dartball, weddings, women's events, men's events, Bible studies, recreation nights, and more.

"We had planned for a larger foyer area and off the kitchen, a full gymnasium with additional classrooms," Bigley remembered. "I was pretty excited to hear that the new building committee was moving forward [with that]."

Bigley recalled that the cost of the original build seemed astounding, however, "we moved forward and felt the Lord's calling, and our congregation did a wonderful job of supporting us financially as we paid off the mortgage ahead of schedule. I think that says a lot to the faithfulness of our church family."

It is that same faithfulness that we now move forward to see what God has in store for us as we seek to build for His Kingdom. We are filled with possibilities and opportunities. With God's help, our best days can lie ahead as we anticipate a glorious future.

EMPOWERING LEADERS FOR CHRIST

J iscipleship is at the core of how we grow closer to Christ at Washington Alliance Church. A disciple is one who follows Jesus by obeying His commands, loving one another, bearing much fruit, denying self and encouraging others to be disciples.

We are experiencing growth, not only in ministries, but also in relationships as we seek to share the Gospel of Jesus.

"God is using our ministries to open the truth of His Word



to many people," said Travis Crouse, an elder at Washington Alliance Church and co-chair of the Building Committee. "God is providing a place for families to have their children deeply learn the Bible while also learning the truth of the Bible through our Sunday adult sermons."

The growth God has brought to us has come with some challenges. Many have experienced the bottlenecked hallways on a Sunday morning while trying to move to various classrooms. Adult classes and meeting opportunities have been limited due to space availability. Our teenagers in the youth program do not have a space of their own and find themselves borrowing areas of the church that are ultimately too small.

"Our students continue to grow and mature, which has translated into a willingness to invite friends and speak the Gospel to those around them," said Corey Miller, youth pastor at Washington Alliance Church. "We are currently not equipped to grow, yet we are excited that the Lord continues to bring more and more youth to us!"

We struggle to offer programs simultaneously in our current space, and it is important to be able to offer programs for adults while the children and youth also have their meetings and events. The church is often contacted for opportunities to serve the community through events such as blood drives and meeting space.

"This new space is not being built to gain comfort for our existing ministries, but rather it is meeting the needs of our ministries that have already outgrown our existing spaces," Crouse emphasized. "It will also provide opportunity for ministry growth larger than we can dream at this moment."

We recognize that God is at work. He is bringing new people to us; all ages are engaged in worship; salvations and baptisms are happening; people are receiving Christian counseling in our building with the Christian Counseling Coalition; people and families with special needs are seeking a place to worship; God is calling many of our members to become foster parents, creating a network of families that can encourage one another in that area. Praise be to the Lord!

ADULT MINISTRIES AT A GLANCE:

The Need: Classrooms for Bible study and discipleship to happen simultaneously with other classes, worship, or events; a meeting space for fellowship where deep or casual conversations can be freely and easily had.

The Plan: Rooms in the back of the Worship Center will allow for small group meetings; an expanded café area will offer comfort and space for relational connections.

YOUTH MINISTRIES AT A GLANCE:

The Need: A space to call their own and the ability to host game nights, special concerts and events; a room to provide genuine worship and relational connections.

The Plan: A youth worship center; recreational and fellowship area for hanging out and for Bible study; a multi-use gymnasium.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES AT A GLANCE:

The Need: A larger infant to 2-year-old nursery; a decompressing area for special needs; larger gathering spaces for elementary kids; a recreation area for games and events.

The Plan:

Reconfiguration of a nursery, toddler and pre-k area; a sensory room; larger classrooms; a multi-use gymnasium.

We recognize that a new addition at our current location will act in part as a "sending center" to reach the world for Christ. As people of all ages are discipled weekly through the various programs and services offered, they then go out to impact their surroundings.

Service projects are emphasized at Washington Alliance, including in our children's ministries.

"In Uptown Kids, using God's Word as our foundation, we

strive to train and equip our children to become disciples of Jesus," said Kim Greenleaf, director of children's ministries at Washington Alliance Church. "We offer frequent opportunities for the children to put their 'faith in action!' As a disciple of Jesus, we value serving others. Creating gifts for our shut-ins and sick, participating in global projects, giving offerings to a yearly Alliance Children's Missions Project, making blessing bags for others in our community, and even providing opportunities for the children to serve within our ministry are but a few examples of how our children engage in service."

It doesn't stop there. Every year, we participate in the national campaign of Operation Christmas Child. Locally, we have opened our building to host Toys for Tots, offer space for home school co-ops, weddings, funerals, counseling

collaborations and more.

Outside of our building, we are regularly involved with City Mission in downtown Washington and our youth participate each summer with Mission Washington, a weeklong,



community collaboration to benefit the people, parks and places of Washington, Pa., through various service projects. Our VBS program, Adventure at the Park, meets the community right where they are at Washington Park. Our church bus ministry is able to give rides to families and children from lower income communities so they can participate in Adventure at the Park, Awana, Sunday morning services, and other activities throughout the year.

Over the years, we have celebrated with churchgoers who have answered the call to missions, going overseas to serve full-time or staying state-side to impact areas and people in need. Many people throughout the past several years have experienced a short-term missions trip to the Dominican Republic with Meeting God in Missions.
