### **Takeaways**

1.	Christians are called to show unconditional love, not unconditional
2.	<ul> <li>Being quick to call to account is to invite God to call to account</li> <li>✓ Those who so readily pass judgment on their peers will find that their peers similarly pass judgment on them</li> <li>✓ The measure you give will be the measure you get (Mark 4:24)</li> </ul>
3.	"Jesus is drawing attention to a curious feature of the human race in which a profound ignorance of oneself is so often combined with an arrogant presumption of knowledge about others, especially about their faults" (Logos Bible Software)  → Pointing out someone else's sin does not yours

We break this command when we...

- ✓ judge others based on appearance
- ✓ think the worst of others
- $\checkmark$  only speak to others of their faults
- ✓ judge an entire life only by its worst moments
- ✓ judge the hidden motives of others
- ✓ judge others without considering ourselves in their same circumstances
- ${m ec {m ec {\it v}}}$  judge others without being mindful that we ourselves will be judged

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#### **Sermon Talks**

- 1. What caught your attention in this week's message? Was there something you had never heard before or something you had a question about?
- 2. What does it mean to judge others? Who is to judge? Are Christians forbidden from ever judging others?
- 3. How can we, as Christians, show unconditional love without showing unconditional approval? List some examples.
- 4. Many people will say that Christians are judgmental and intolerant. They will cite examples of Jesus, such as when a woman caught in adultery was brought to Him (John 8), as reasons why we should be tolerant. Do they have a point? Why or why not.
- 5. How do we balance confronting people with their sin and the fact that God is THE judge?
- 6. Read Matthew 7:3-5 again. What is Jesus saying here? How does that apply to us today? What do the speck and the plank represent?
- 7. Go back to the 'Sermon Notes' section and reread the list of ways we break Jesus' command in Matthew 7:1-5.
  - Are there any of those examples that resonate with you or that you are guilty of?
     If so, pray and confess them to God and receive His forgiveness.
- 8. Here are some cross-reference scriptures about judging and some scriptures about confronting sin:
  - Cross-references: James 4:11-12, John 3:17, Romans 2:1-3, Romans 14:1-13
  - Confronting Sin: Matthew 18:15, Luke 17:3, Galatians 6:1, 1 Timothy 5:20

Pray about it: Meditate on God's Word (Matthew 7:1-5) and this week's message.

**Adoration**: What can I praise God for in light of what this teaches me?

**Confession**: What sin can I confess because of what this teaches me?

**Thanksgiving**: What can I thank God for in light of what He has done?

Supplication: What do I need to ask of God in order to grow in light of this?
