- 4. Review the three types of relativism. What are potential dangers of believing any or all of them?
- 5. Review the Biblical definition of truth as seen through God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and His Word. What is the fundamental difference between relative truth verses absolute truth (Biblical truth)?
- 6. In the first three verses of 2 John, why does John make a point to emphasize that truth must travel from our head to our heart and then to our hands?
- 7. In 1 John 5, we saw that "love" is spelled "o.b.e.y". In 2 John, how does John link the words "love" and "truth" together?
- 8. Why is it so important to be aware of deceivers, or imposters, of truth? What are some examples of imposters that we see in our world today?
- 9. Have you experienced false teaching? How should we respond to false teaching?
- 10. What do you think the "fullness of truth" is that John wants every believer to have?

Confession: What sin can I confess because of what this teaches me?
