

- 1. What caught your attention in this week's message? Was there something you had never heard before or something you had a question about?
- 2. How do people today try to justify their sins, similar to how some in Paul's time argued that sin could bring glory to God?
- 3. How do you respond when God's justice doesn't seem fair? How does Paul challenge our way of thinking in this passage?
- 4. In what ways have you personally experienced God's faithfulness, even when you have fallen short?
- 5. Paul says, "There is no one righteous, not even one" (v. 10). Why is it important to understand our sinful nature before we can appreciate the gospel?
- 6. How does our culture define "goodness" or "righteousness," and how does that compare to what Paul says in this passage?
- 7. Based on this passage, how would you explain the gospel to someone who believes they are "good enough" to go to heaven?
- 8. Paul says that **boasting is excluded** (v. 27). Why is pride dangerous when it comes to our faith?
- 9. How should knowing that our righteousness comes from faith in Jesus affect the way we treat others—especially those who struggle with sin?

Pray about it: Meditate on God's Word (Romans 3) and this week's message.

Adoration: What can I praise God for in light of what this teaches me?

Confession: What sin can I confess because of what this teaches me?

Thanksgiving: What can I thank God for in light of what he has done?

Supplication: What do I need to ask of God in order to grow in light of this?
