

Sermon Talks

- 1. Read Romans 14.
- 2. What were some key takeaways from this passage for you? What challenges do you face in your walk with Jesus as a result of this passage?
- 3. One of the themes Paul seems to emphasize in Romans 14 is unity over uniformity. In what ways does the local church tend to miss the mark in this area?
- 4. In what ways have you seen Satan try and bring division to the body of Christ? What lessons can be learned from those examples?
- 5. Paul begins this chapter by telling his readers to "not argue about disputed matters." Define the phrase disputed matters.
- 6. Paul says in verse 6 that those who fall on both sides of a dispute can, and often do, honor the Lord with their choices. He goes on in verses 10-12 to ask, "Why do you judge your brother and sister?" Then he asks, "Or you, why do you despise your brother and sister?"
 - How would you answer the questions Paul poses in these verses?
- 7. In what ways does this passage change your perspective? How should you treat people who disagree with you on non-essential issues?
- 8. If there is something you have a conviction against, how do you prevent yourself from judging those who do not share that same conviction?
- 9. What does God call us to do instead of dividing over differing convictions? How can you live out this principle?
- 10. Read Colossians 4:2-6. Allow the Holy Spirit to guide you in a time of prayer.

Pray about it: Meditate on God's Word (Romans 14) and this week's message.

Adoration: What can I praise God for in light of what this teaches me?

Confession: What sin can I confess because of what this teaches me?

Thanksgiving: What can I thank God for in light of what he has done?

Supplication: What do I need to ask of God in order to grow in light of this?
