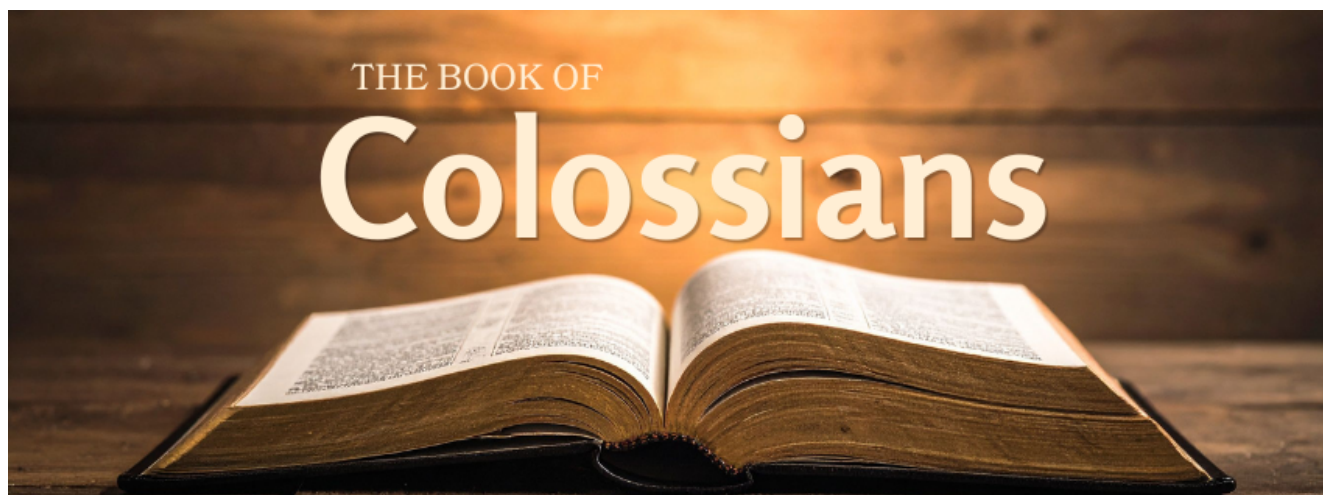

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Sermon Talks

1. Read Colossians 1:15-20 as you prepare to work through the sermon talks.
2. What is the most beautiful or majestic thing you have ever seen in creation? How did it make you feel?
3. In your experience, what perceptions of Jesus do people have that are contrary to scripture? Why do you think they believe those perceptions?
4. Satan is the author of confusion and wants people to be confused about the Bible and who Jesus is. In what ways have you witnessed Satan bringing confusion, whether in your life or in the lives of others? How have you responded to that?
5. What difficulties do you have in relating to an invisible God? How has Jesus overcome those difficulties?
6. Verse 16 says everything was created by Him, through Him, and for Him. How does changing your mindset to realize "I was created for Jesus" change your daily life?
7. Verse 17 reminds us that Jesus is the Sustainer, meaning He holds all things together. In what areas of your life right now do you need to trust that Jesus is holding things together?
8. How does it feel to know you have been delivered from darkness and transferred into Christ's kingdom?
9. What does it mean to let Jesus be the head of the church and your life?
10. What does it mean for Jesus to have "supremacy" or "first place" in everything? What holds you back from giving Him first place in your calendar, finances, or relationships?
11. Jesus is Savior and Lord (vv. 19-20). The bad news is that our sin makes us enemies of God, alienating us from Him. The good news is that God chose to take the initiative to reconcile us to himself or to make peace with us. How do you respond to knowing what it cost God to reconcile us sinners to Himself?
12. Allow the Holy Spirit to guide you in a time of prayer. Begin by praising God for who He is and what He has done in your life. Praise Him for your salvation.
